Rules and Regulations 2016

1. The fair will be held during Farmers' Market hours 3:00-7:00 pm on Wednesday September 21st at the Hillhurst Sunnyside Community Association.
2. All entries must be received between 4:30 and 8:30pm on September 20th or between 11am and 2pm on September 21st. They will remain on display until 7:00pm on September 21st. Items must be picked up by 7:30pm as the Fair will not be responsible for any exhibits left after 7:30pm, and will be disposed of as the organizers see fit.
3. The Harvest Fair will not be liable for any loss or damage to the entries.
4. All entries must be grown or made by the exhibitor. Infringement of this rule will result in disqualification.
5. All produce entries must have been grown within the city limits of the City of Calgary using organic growing methods. All created entries (jams, pies) must contain organic ingredients produced within the city limits, although not necessarily grown by the maker. Exceptions to this rule would be flour, sugar, salt, spices, and other simple sundry items.
6. All entries which include photographs or art must have been created in the year of the competition.
7. Each exhibitor must complete an entry tag which can be purchased when dropping off the item. The entry fee is \$1.00 for 18 years and up, free for those under 18 years.
8. All entries must be entered into a specific category and age class. An individual may submit multiple entries to any category.
9. Judging will occur between 3pm and 5 pm on September 21st. Judging areas will be roped off and members of the public will not be allowed to interact with the judges during the judging.
10. No name will be visible to the judges until after the award has been made.
11. The decision of the judge or judges shall be final in awarding of ribbons. In the absence of competition in any category, judges may award such ribbons as they deem the entry worthy of.
